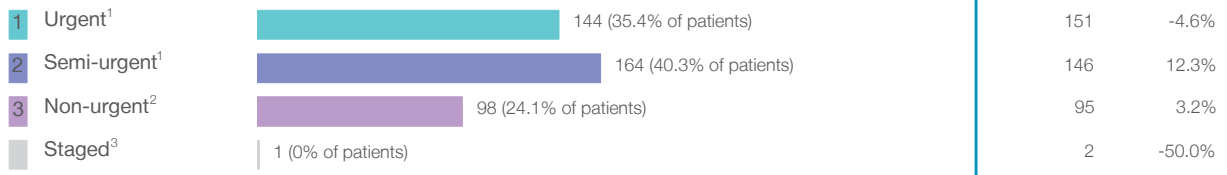


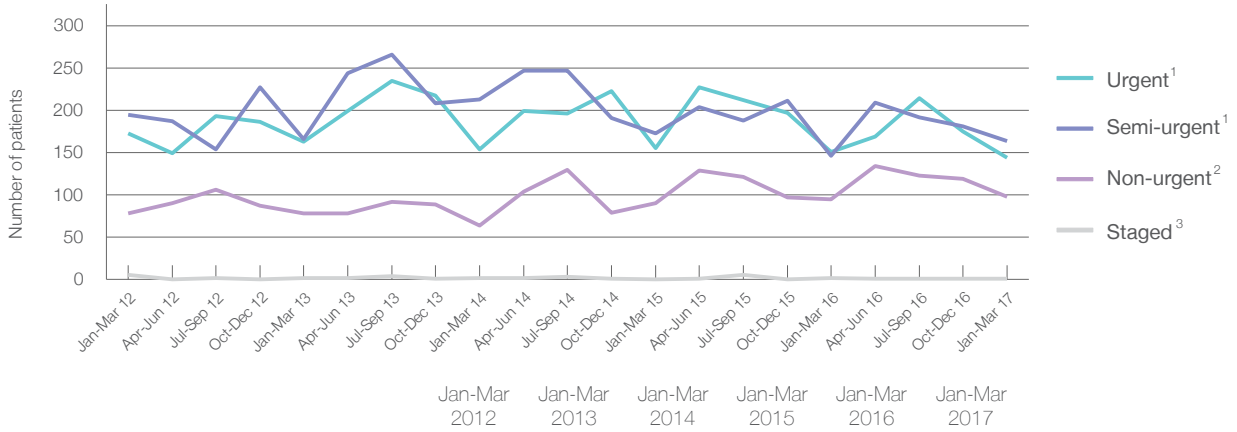

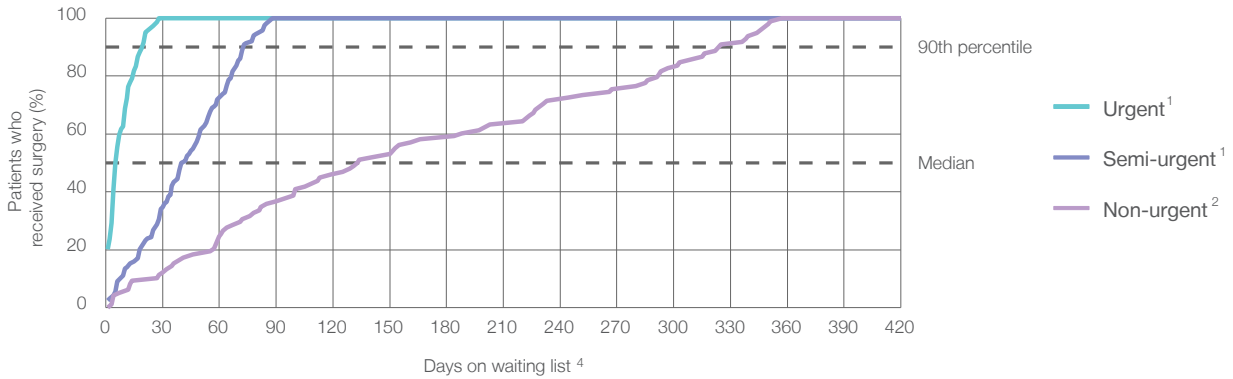

Percentage of patients who received elective surgery by waiting time (days)








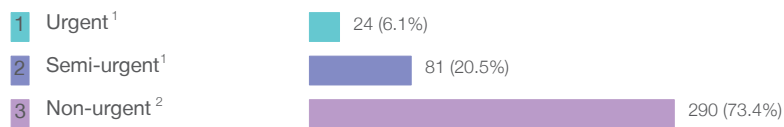
