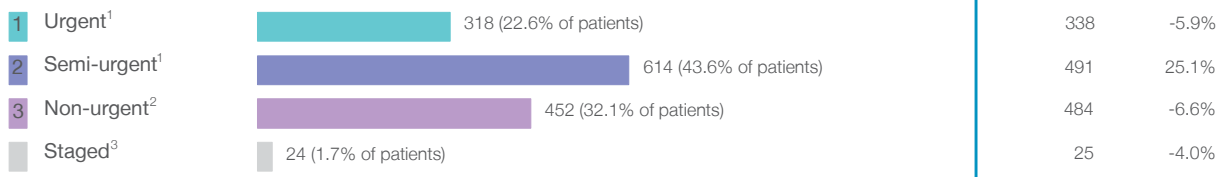

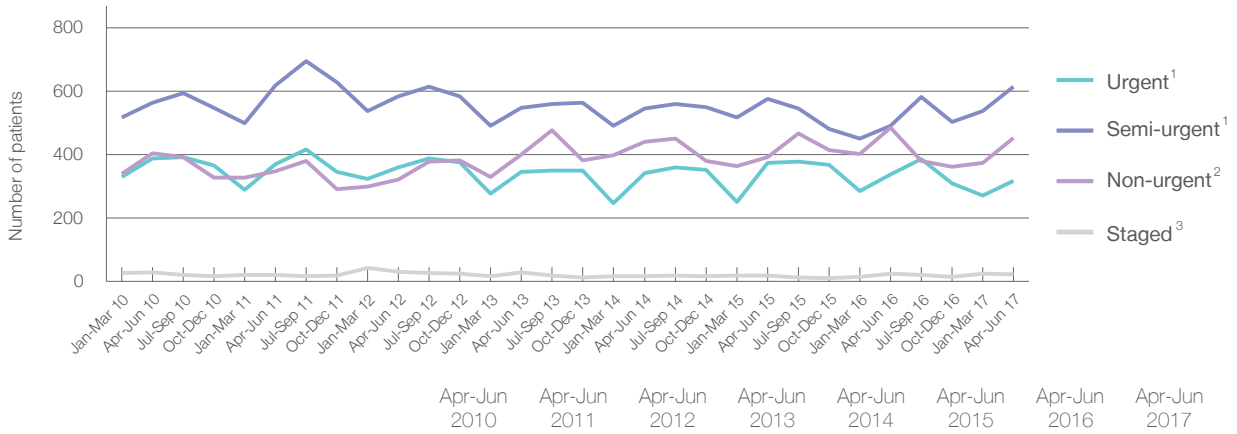

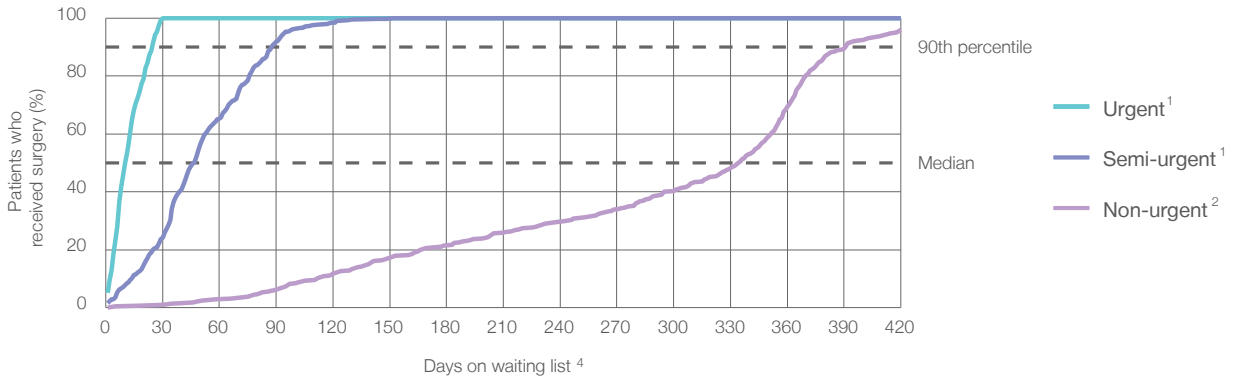

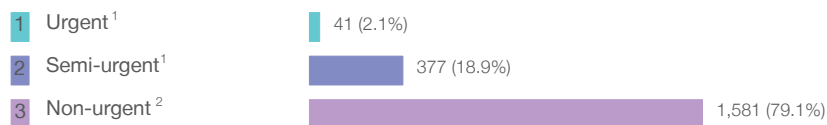

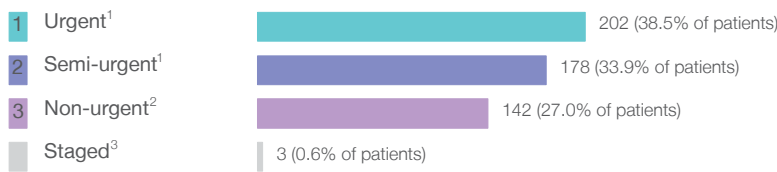

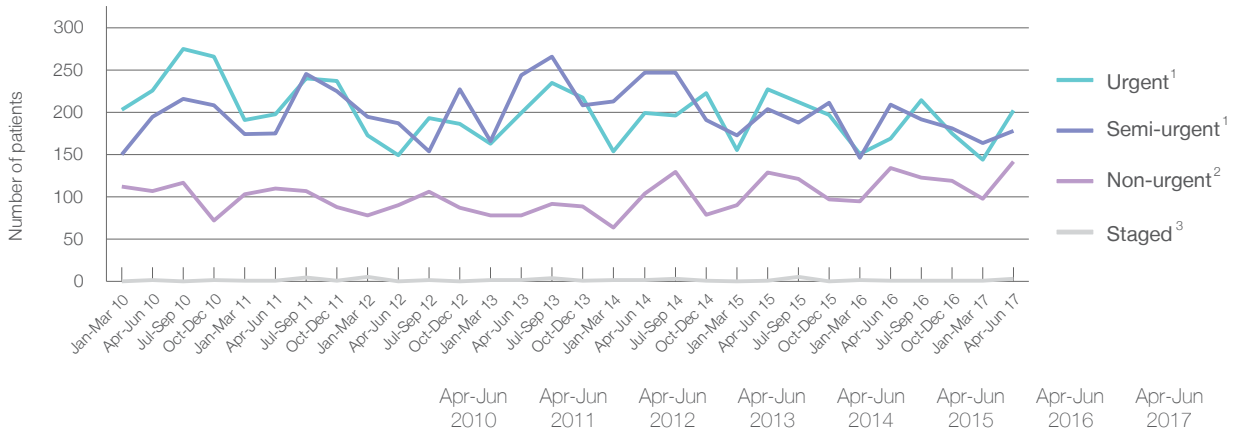

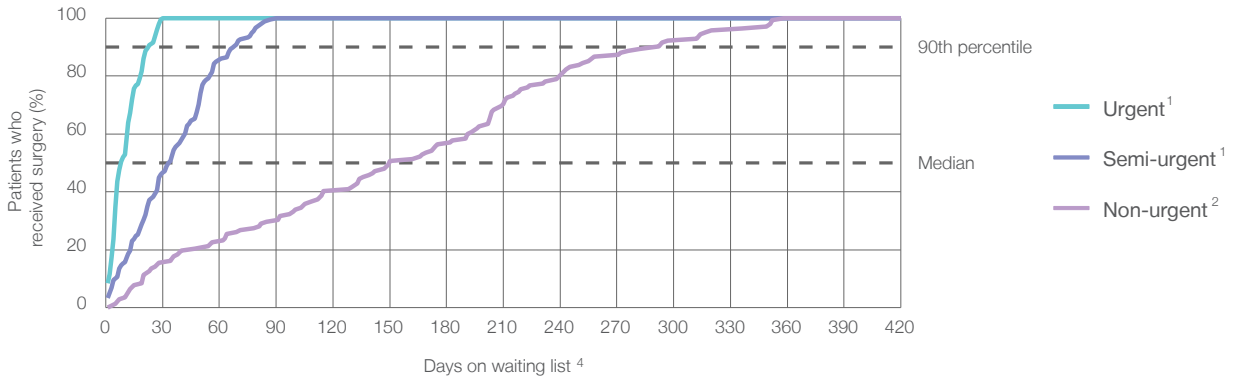

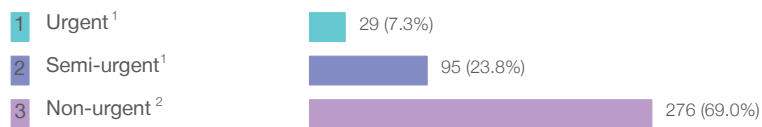

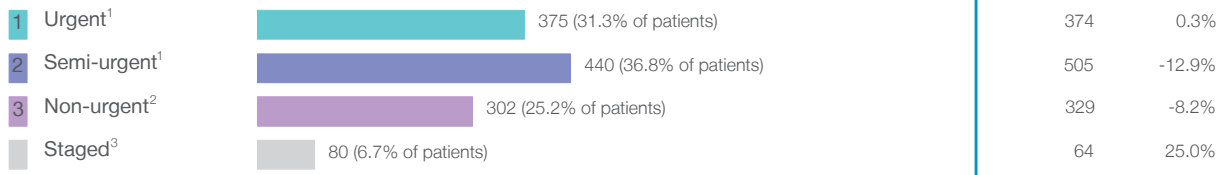

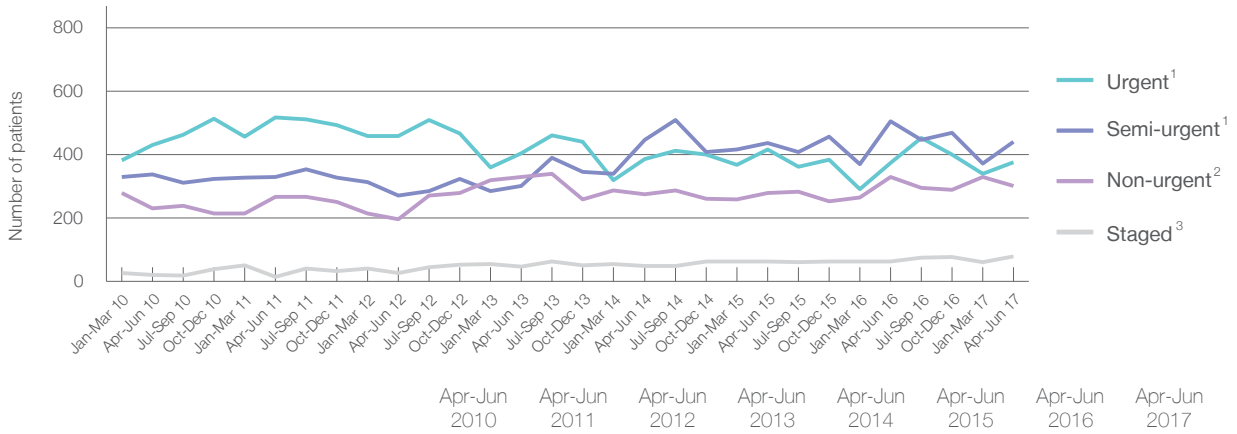

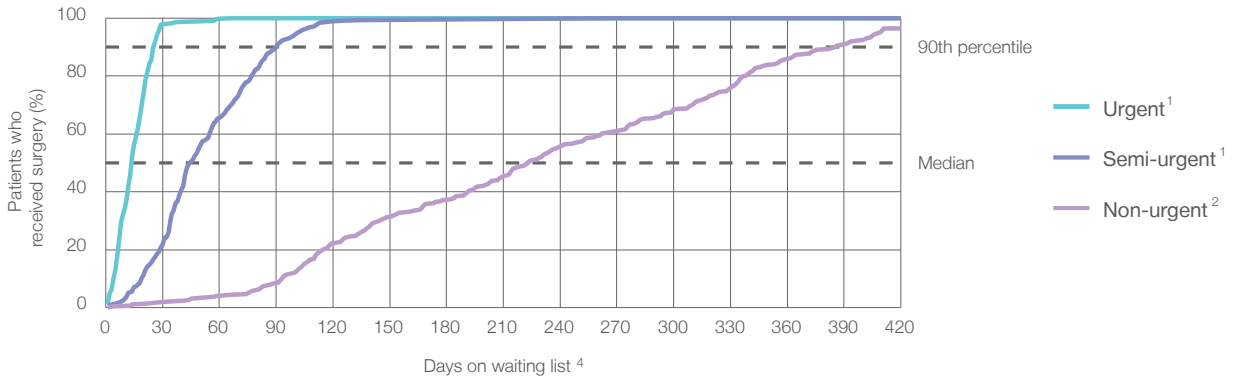

April to June 2017

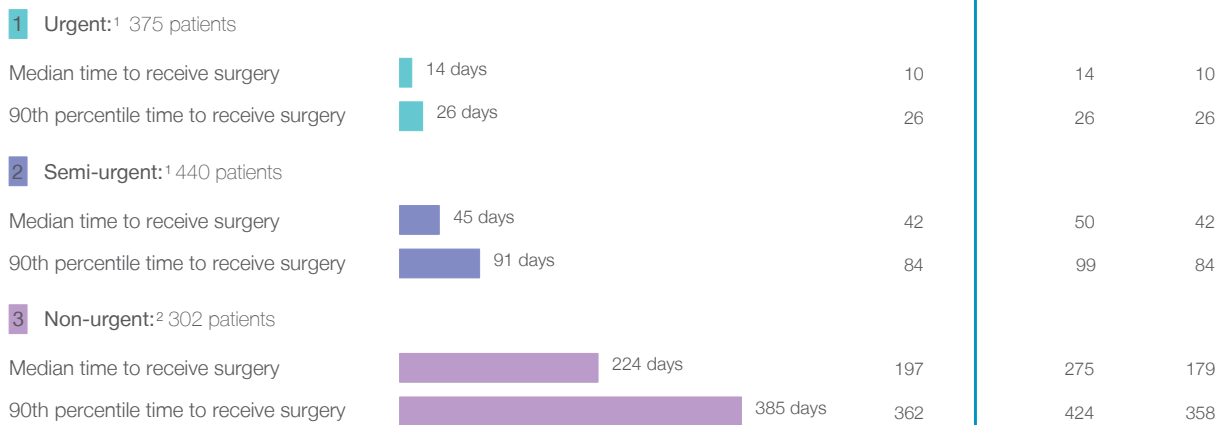
Percentage of patients who received surgery within the clinically recommended timeframe

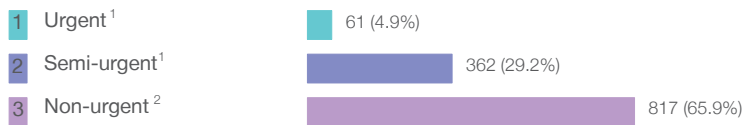

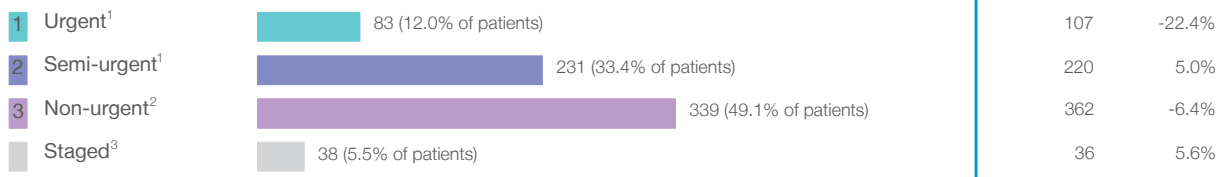

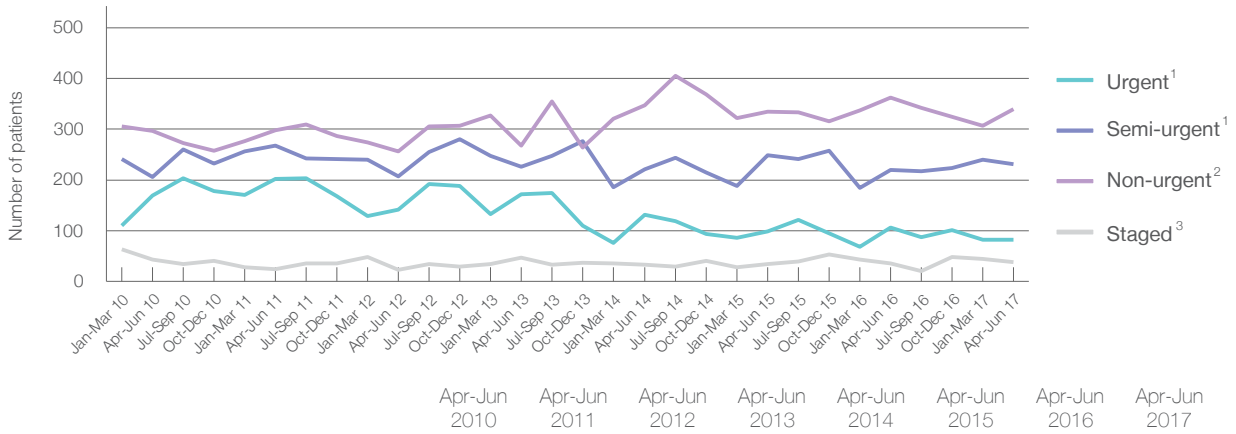

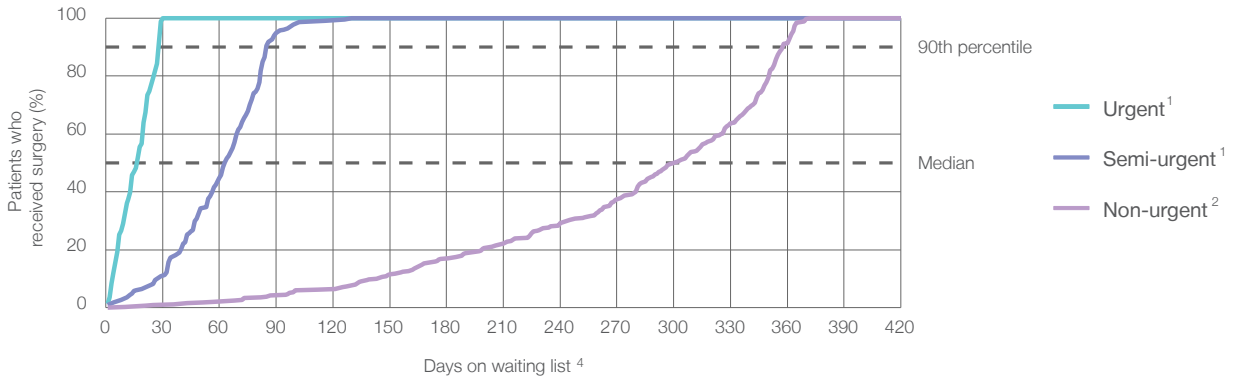

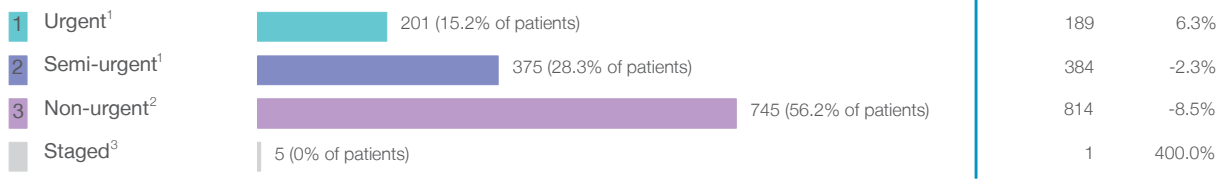

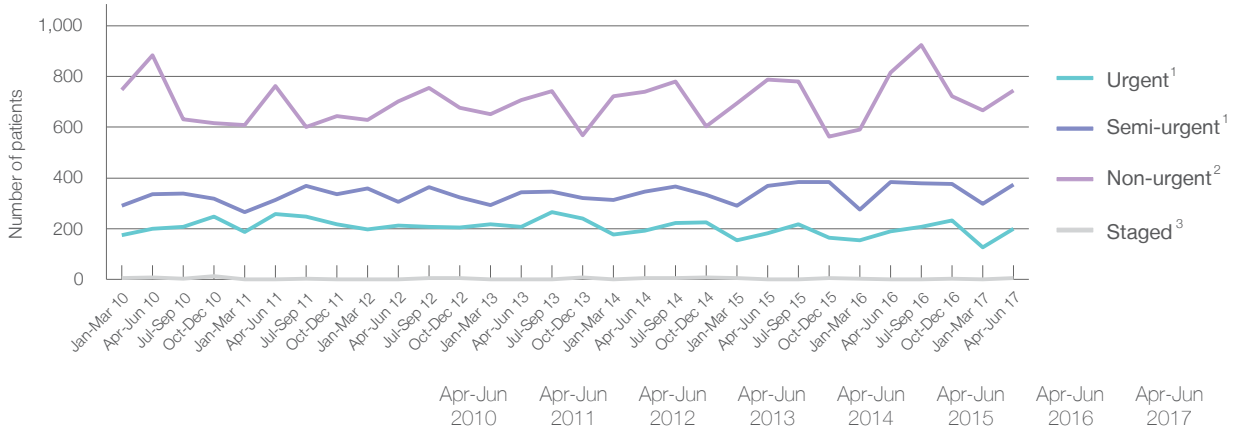

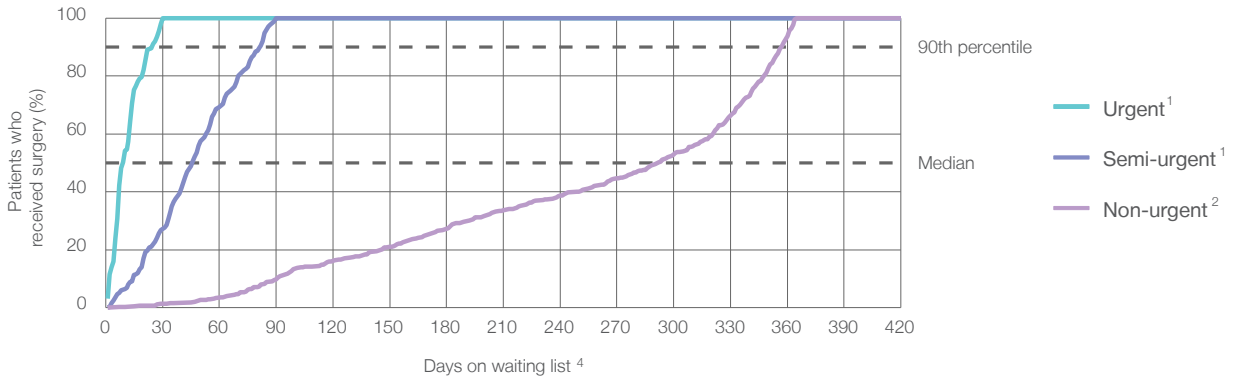

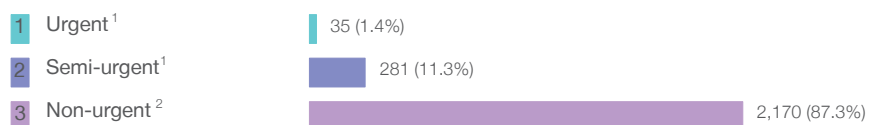
